Accelerated Programs

Advanced placement classes in grades 9-12 are offered in English Language, Literature and Composition, World History, U.S. History, Statistics, Biology, Physics, Micro-economics, and Calculus.

Accelerated Math

Students in grades K-8 can be identified for accelerated math classes including Algebra and Geometry.

Vocational Programs

45 % of Oak Hill students attend the Lewiston Regional Technical Center in Lewiston.

Alternate Programs

The Alternate School program has a Student enrollment of 26 students in grades 10 –12.

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Performance Data

Maine Educational Assessment is administered grade 3-8 and Maine High School Assessment in grade 11

The MEA is a challenging test composed of a combination of multiple-choice questions, items that require the Construction of written responses, and essays. It demands that students use complex thinking skills to answer questions requiring interpretation, inference, application, analysis, synthesis, and evaluation of information.

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Adequate Yearly Progress

Adequate Yearly Progress, AYP, is the term used to describe the academic progress expected of each school each year. AYP calculations are based on assessment scores from Maine Educational Assessment (MEA) in reading and in math. The scores on the assessments for the three student subgroups determine AYP (1) whole group, which is all students, (2) economically disadvantaged students, and (3) students with disabilities. All three student sub-groups must attain the expected levels of academic progress in order to meet AYP. States are required to include (1) student participation rate in the assessment and (2) the average daily attendance for the elementary grades and graduation rates for high schools.

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
